HUNTER EAST HARLEM

Finally, far uptown, "Anchor," a show at <u>Hunter College's East Harlem gallery</u>, says a lot, and on an unflashy human scale, about an old New York many people don't know. Organized by the gallery director <u>Arden Sherman</u>, it focuses on the photography of <u>Hiram Maristany</u>, who was born in this neighborhood to Puerto Rican parents and in 1969 became the official photographer for the Young Lords, a party of Puerto Rican activists modeled after the Black Panthers. More than two dozen of Mr. Maristany's wonderful black-and-white pictures are on view, along with projects by six young artists — Nicole Cohen, Selena Kimball, Miguel Luciano, Steven Perez, Saul Williams and Caroline Woolard — who have been inspired by them, and by his example. Small though it is, the result is a complex show that extends out into the surrounding neighborhood. And it's only one I saw in which an old establishment seems to be giving birth to something genuinely new.
