

## In Central Park, Naumburg Orchestral Concerts Are a Gift to the City

The elms of Central Park were young in 1905, when a musical businessman founded the Naumburg Orchestral Concerts. In this summer's series, on the evening of July 17, the chamber collective the Knights pairs Brahms's rollicking "Hungarian Dances" with Anna Clyne's elegy for her mother, the calmly devastating "Within Her Arms." On July 31, the Orchestra of St. Luke's and the soprano Sherezade Panthaki collaborate on an all-Vivaldi program. Like the Park, the concerts are free—a gift to the city's people.
