Although she is known for her beautiful paintings, Nancy Lorenz has gathered a following among architects and collectors eager to commission her large luminous works for interior decoration installations.

Her work embodies an East-meets-West kind of style. Techniques refined from Oriental craftsmanship are partnered with the bold, gestural brushwork of Abstract Expressionism. Lorenz lived in Toyko with her family for 5 years in her teens and became "enamored with Asian crafts" and several degrees later, developed this beautiful style.

Her sense of aesthetic for both design and fine art has become a go-to for Hollywood's elite, such as Cindy Crawford. Her work can also be seen in highprofile places such as the Obama White House, the Chanel flagship store in Paris, and several museums of art around the country.
