Morgan Lehman is pleased to present Katia Santibañez: *The Visible and the Invisible*. This will be Santibañez's fourth solo show with the gallery.

In preparing for this exhibition, Santibañez studied the work of French philosopher Gilles Deleuze (1925 – 1995) who, in 1988, recorded an eight-hour movie called *ABECEDAIRE*, each letter relating to a word which then became integrated into the film's dialogue.

Similarly, Santibañez has chosen two words for each letter of the alphabet that relate to the inspiration she finds in philosophy, politics, and literature, as well as other artists or personalities who have had an impact on her life.
